



NON-BINARY GENDER MARKER INFORMATION:

We would like to make you aware of the new policy implemented by the US Department of State. Beginning on April 11 of 2022, U.S. citizens are now able to select an “X” as their gender marker on their U.S. passport application.

Updating Your Gender Marker on an Existing Passport

If you are applying to change your gender marker you must apply in person.

You will need to complete and submit:

1. Application for U.S. Passport;
2. Proof of U.S. Citizenship (certified Birth Certificate, Certificate of Naturalization, or Report of Birth Abroad);
3. Proof of Identity that contains your signature and photograph that is “a good likeness to you” (U.S. Passport, a Driver’s License, a Certificate of Naturalization, Military Identification, or a Government Employee Identification Card). You must present the original AND provide a photocopy of the front and back side with your application;
4. A recent color photograph 2x2 inches in size;
5. If you are changing your name on your passport, an Order for Name Change (certified copy showing a seal and judge signature);
6. Fee (See [Department of State Passport Fees](#)).

Take these documents and fees in person to any Passport Acceptance Facility.
